Utopia Project is an Alternative Education Provider for young people on the Wirral who are at risk of becoming disengaged from their current educational setting. Led by 3 directors who felt that the formal education system was not catering for all young people's skill set, the company began trading in September 2014 and is currently oversubscribed. Utopia Project provides all of its young people with an accessible curriculum that is active and engaging. With a specific focus on key personal and social skills such as; confidence, resilience, motivation and teamwork.

At the core of Utopia's ethos is the belief that young people need a supportive and nurturing environment and the opportunity to develop personal and social skills in a practical way. The company now works with schools in the Wirral region and beyond to provide high quality support and valuable learning opportunities to their most disengaged young people.

Participants enrolled on the Utopia Programme complete qualifications including; Employability skills, BTEC Sport and Active Leisure, BTEC Creative Media Production and BTEC Child Care, along side other short courses such as; BTEC Home Cooking, Sports Leader Award and Duke of Edinburgh Award. The curriculum is designed to engender a sense of achievement and to raise self-esteem. The Utopia curriculum model also addresses key skills gaps in young people's education by providing 1:1/small group English and Maths intervention. Enabling young people to develop confidence in a smaller setting and work towards GCSE and Functional Skills qualifications. This pioneering strategy has proved massively successful in supporting learners to overcome previous barriers to learning and as such we are looking to expand this provision in 2021/22.

The successful candidate will be an outstanding, passionate and resilient English specialist who will make a significant contribution to our companies mission statement; *'To be relentless in the pursuit of educational equality'*.
