Utopia is a Wirral based education provider currently in the process of becoming an independent special school for boys and girls aged 14-16 with social, emotional and mental health needs, autism and those experiencing emotionally based school avoidance. We are a small setting for up to 20 learners, providing intensive and personalised support for those with an Education Health and Care Plan (EHCP) who benefit from a nurturing environment.

Founded in 2014 by directors with a wealth of experience in engaging young people with additional needs, the Utopia model acknowledged that accelerated academic progress could be made by adopting a different approach. For the past 9 years Utopia has supported hundreds of young people with additional needs, gaining outcomes and supporting progression through Alternative Provision. Our mission to provide Accessible, Approachable and Aspirational support in a way that puts learners at the heart of the decision-making process has created a culture and environment of collaboration, with learners and parents alike. It is our responsibility to provide a safe, caring and nurturing environment that learners can access with confidence. Our ability to build trusting and meaningful relationships enables us to make long-lasting, posvitive change that helps young people to realise their potential and creates a sense of belonging for all learners who are part of our community.

Learners enrolled on Utopia Programmes complete qualifications including, BTEC's in Sport, Media, Child Care, Business and Teamwork & Personal Skills, along side other short courses such as; BTEC Home Cooking, Sports Leader Award and First Aid qualifications. Designed to engender a sense of achievement and to raise self-esteem the curriculum model also addresses key skills gaps in young people's education by providing 1:1/small group English and Maths intervention. This enables young people to develop confidence in a smaller setting and work towards GCSE and Functional Skills qualifications. This pioneering strategy has proved massively successful in supporting learners to overcome previous barriers to education and as we move towards independent school status, we are looking to grow our dedicated team of teachers and support staff.

The successful candidate will be an outstanding, passionate and resilient individual, with experience in planning, delivering and evaluating the effectiveness of teaching and learning. They will make a significant contribution to the organisations expansion and be committed to our mission statement; 'To be relentless in the pursuit of educational equality'.

Professional Duties

- To plan, deliver and develop the vocational curriculum at Utopia.

- To support whole centre staff development by contributing to staff training and managing Learning Support Assistants
- To communicate effectively with young people, parents/carers and referral agency representatives.
- To support the pastoral development of students by attending multi agency meetings.
- To ensure that all young people are safe and to follow Utopia child protection and safeguarding policy and procedures at all times.
- Work within the framework of the Utopia policies and procedures.
